YOUR 2010 MAHF INDUCTEES**CAM BROWN****Winnipeg**

Cam has had a very diverse career in agriculture: Ag Rep at Roblin, District Agriculturist at Hanna, AB; Field Supervisor with Manitoba Pool Elevators; Livestock Nutritionist with Manitoba Agriculture; Director of Research at the Rapeseed Association of Canada and Director of Market Development at the Canadian Wheat Board. Cam was involved in the development of new varieties of wheat and barley for export markets. In 1980, he became Vice President and Director of Marketing for Feed-Rite Mills Ltd. Upon retirement, he was appointed a Director of Ridley Inc., the Australian company that purchased Feed-Rite.

Cam has received numerous honours and awards from his peers for his service to his industry and his profession.

ANTON & ADELINE CHORNEY**East Selkirk**

Early on, the Chorneys chose to specialize in seed potatoes, table potatoes and registered seed wheat. As early participants in the significant growth of Manitoba's potato industry, this decision became the prime focus of their life's work. Their regular exhibits of prize-winning potatoes brought them numerous awards and widespread recognition.

Anton was very involved in the Vegetable Growers' Association of Manitoba, the local Ag Society and the Manitoba Seed Growers Association. Over the years the Chorneys hosted numerous visitors and bus tours. In 1967, during Canada's centennial, the Chorneys were honoured to host the current Lord Selkirk during his visit to Canada.

The Chorneys were actively involved in their community, supporting the Hospital Auxiliary, the Extension Advisory and the ARDA development boards, the 4-H Potato Club and the 4-H Leaders' Association.

DOUG FLETCHER**Carman**

Born and educated in Argyle, MB, Doug later attended the Manitoba Agricultural College, where he obtained a Degree in Agriculture. He later attained a Masters Degree in Economics from the University of Manitoba. Doug was an Ag Rep with the Manitoba Department of Agriculture in Shoal Lake and later in Carman. In 1937, he married Iris Campbell.

Doug was highly regarded for his ability in the field of farm management, particularly his technical competence in soils and crops. He was an early promoter of soil testing in the Carman District and the establishment of the Manitoba Soils Testing Lab. Upon his retirement from Manitoba Agriculture in 1971, Doug was elected Mayor of Carman, where he was active in the Pembina Valley Development Association and the Lower Red River Valley Water Commission. He was the driving force behind the Boyne River Diversion to prevent flooding in Carman.

HUGH JAMESON**Brandon**

Hugh was raised on the farm where he, his wife Martha and three of their four sons now operate a 50 cow dairy farm, a 200 Angus beef herd, a 20,000 laying hen operation and 4,500 acres of grain land.

Hugh served 10 years on the Manitoba Milk Producers Board, and represented Manitoba at annual conferences held by the Dairy Farmers of Canada.

Locally, Hugh served on the Board of the Provincial Exhibition for 21 years, as President from 1984 – 86 and as Chairman of Manitoba Livestock Expo. As a director of the Brandon Keystone Centre, he was involved in the expansion of the Keystone Centre in the early 90's.

Hugh was a counsellor on the Farm Debt Review Board for 12 years and Chair of Cornwallis Municipality's 100th Anniversary in 1984.

JACOB SCHULZ**Grandview**

Jake was born in Russia and raised in Romania. In 1930, he, his wife Amelia and their first child, Herbert, immigrated to Canada, where they settled in the Grandview area. Jake joined the co-operative movement and served as councillor of the RM of Grandview, contributing to significant road improvements.

He believed in man's rational capacity to work toward goals of fairness and greater equality in society. In 1950, Mr. Schulz became founding president of the Manitoba Farmers Union and in the 1950's served as chairman of the Interprovincial Farm Union Council, the forerunner of the National Farmers Union. He was elected to Parliament in the 1957 general election, representing Springfield for the Co-operative Commonwealth Federation, serving only one year.

Mr. Schulz later founded a construction company and in 1960 wrote two books, *The Rise and Fall of Farm Organizations* and *The American Nightmare*.
